Existing healthtech services on the continent largely target the small proportion of the population that can already afford healthcare. The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic has led to an increase in innovation in the African healthtech sector as the outbreak has laid bare the state of healthcare systems, the welfare of professionals, and the vulnerability of an overstretched system.

Supporting the growth of an inclusive healthtech sector and start-ups that address wider public health issues is critical for the future. Academic institutions are important actors in facilitating effective and innovative responses as are the legal sector and other professional services support to start-ups and SMEs in the sector. Dr Wuleta Lemma has always had a deep love for Africa. Born in Ethiopia, she pursued degrees in medicine, epidemiology and international health abroad, but decided to build her career back home. She wanted to work with vaccines, but was disturbed to discover that many of Ethiopia's healthcare information systems were still paper-based, out of date and inaccurate. In a country with a population of over 96 million, this had a significant impact on the quality of local healthcare.

That's when she, together with the Tulane University Centre for Global Health Equity (CGHE), developed the TenaCare suite. [TenaCare](#) is a series of national eHealth and mHealth applications. The suite consists of an Electronic Medical Record System, a Health Management Information and Disease Surveillance System, and an analytics dashboard. All of these applications work together to enhance health systems and improve the quality of health service delivery.

Dr. Mayega joined Makerere's School of Public Health in January 2006, as a Research Fellow and Assistant Lecturer. From 2006 to 2012, he worked as an Instructional Materials Designer/Editor for the Master's Degree in Public Health by Distance Education. Dr. Mayega was appointed to the position of Lecturer, Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics in August 2012, which he has held since then.

Dr. Mayega is co-investigator of a multi-country research group that is conducting a cluster randomized trial to test an innovative intervention for integration and improvement of prevention and care for type 2 diabetes at primary care levels in different socio-economic settings (SMART2D). Dr. Mayega is extensively experienced in Resilience programming. He has developed this experience from being part of the following programs: Program Coordinator, Health Emergencies Management Project (HEMP), supported by USAID and the Rockefeller Foundation; Program Coordinator for the Strengthening Leadership in Disaster Resilience Project (SLDRP), supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, and World Bank's GFDRR; Program Coordinator and Deputy Project Director, Developing the Next generation Tent to support Human Led Service Delivery; an innovation project funded by USAID - Deputy Chief of Party for the Resilient Africa Network.
